NEWS FROM THE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

As I write this, the atrium of House 2 is full of beautifully decorated cakes and cookies that have been sent in for the [PTA bake sale](#). It is really heartwarming that a request like that gets so much response from our Elementary parents. Thank you!

Yesterday's [Elementary Matinee](#) was an amazing experience. More than 20 students demonstrated both their musical talent and their risk taking skills by performing for an audience of about 60 people. Everyone did a great job and a few of the performers were breath taking! Congratulations to all the children who participated and to their parents (for driving them to lessons, nagging to practice, encouraging each effort!) Thanks also to Brent who organized this performance opportunity.



Next week is our [Open House morning](#). This is one of the best opportunities to understand how teaching and learning at BBIS works. First you will listen to a presentation about the role of trans-disciplinary skills and then you will have the opportunity to go into any classroom in the Elementary school (and hopefully you will go into many) and see lessons in progress. At the end there is a question and answer opportunity with all the teachers. We hope to see you there!

There will also be an [Early Literacy Afternoon](#) for the parents of Grade One students at 3:15 pm on Monday, November 30th in Rico's room. We will talk about how children learn to read and write. This is an opportunity to ask general questions about reading, writing, spelling, handwriting, bilingualism, etc. We will arrange someone to supervise the children on the playground during the meeting.

We had an [important visitor](#) this week who was looking at our school. We asked some of our student council members to meet with him to explain from a student's point of view what our school is like. Our student council representatives did an excellent job of answering his questions (after getting over the thrill of sitting at the "board room" type table in the conference room). He asked if school was "hard" and I worried about that he'd think we had low expectations, because the children said "No". However they went on to explain that lots of the work is challenging, but that the teachers are always there to help explain and support them as they work.

I was also impressed when one child said, "We're supposed to speak English at school, but on the playground we can learn each other's languages. I can count to 10 in Korean and to 20 in Hebrew". While on the topic of language, another child added, "... and in the classroom, if we don't understand something, and there's another Arabic child, we can ask them to explain in Arabic." This was especially good to hear, because the "English is our shared language" slogan was never meant to make children feel that their mother tongue wasn't welcome at school. I was very happy to hear that the kids seemed to really understand when it is appropriate to use their different languages.

The [Student Council](#) has just announced their first spirit day: Crazy Hair Day on Friday, November 20. Anyone who wants to can come to school with their hair in a weird style. Any combination of color, gel, rubber bands and ribbons is welcome!

Please remember to keep your child home if they are unwell. This is the season for colds and flu and we would like to keep the transfer of germs to a minimum.

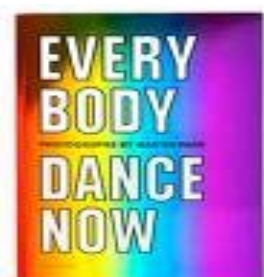

Overall, our teams had again a wonderful GISST weekend and represented our school in a highly positive way. The organising schools have all commented on positive and well mannered attitude of our students. Sportsmanship is the foundation of (team) sports and something we value highly within BBIS and within our Athletic programme.

The results were also very good and after a season with a total of around 75 games for all 4 teams combined, BBIS has gathered 6 points to add to 10 GISST points we scored in the cross country. This brings us to 16 and keeps us in the lead in the overall standing.

Before the October Break, and in the time leading up to the GISST tournament, the Girl's High School team played the Boy's Middle School team as well as a local team, RSV. Both matches were good because they raised the level of play for the girls and helped them to prepare for the matches in the big weekend of the tournament.

When it came to the GISST tournament, the Girl's High School team had a finish they can all be proud of. Although they never lost a match the entire weekend, in the end they had to settle for Third place. The first day of competition, they played 3 back-to-back games, with barely a break in between each. The group games against Berlin International School (BerIS) and Bonn International School were a fight to the finish, with a 1-1 tie against BerIS (with a goal from Lisanne van Wijngaarden) and a 1-0 win over Bonn (with a goal from Luise von Berenburg). Because BBIS's group was so close the standings ended in a tie for first between BerIS and BBIS, leading to a penalty shoot out to determine group rankings. BBIS came out the victors, 4-2, with 2 saves from BBIS goalkeeper Sienna Lyon, and goals scored by Joanna Bartlett, Maud Bijl de Vroe, Isabel Rintanen and Luise von Berenburg. BBIS then was ranked in 1st place in the group, and therefore went on to play immediately in the Semi-finals against Bavaria International School.

The Semi-final match again was well-fought, ending in a 2-2 draw (with both goals coming from Ada von Kayser) which again led to a penalty shoot-out. With our girls so tired they could barely lift their legs, 2 players Isabel Rintanen and Lisanne van Wijngaarden put the ball in the net, and Sienna Lyon made 1 save, but unfortunately Bavaria was able to put one more in, with the penalty shoot-out finishing 3-2, and so BBIS had to concede to play in the Consolation match – the competition for 3rd and 4th. And, well, the girls came out fighting the next day, again playing BerIS, but this time with a much different finish. The final result was 4-0, with Joanna Bartlett leading the scoring, followed by goals from Ada von Kayser, and 2 from Luise von Berenburg. The entire weekend was a great example of teamwork, with all the girls contributing toward the success of the team, and showing

great sportsmanship throughout the competition. They gave all that they could throughout the weekend, and made the best of a tournament that gave them no breaks. Both coaches were extremely proud of all their contributions and the way they played as a total team. What a fine way to finish the official season!
