## “AKTION TAGWERK”

Dear High School Parents,

On Monday, June 21st 2010 BBIS will take part for the fifth time in a fundraising initiative called “Aktion Tagwerk – Your Day for Africa”. On this day High School students have the opportunity to spend one day working in a company of their choice, instead of going to school. The money raised through this effort goes directly to school projects in Burundi.

This social initiative was founded in 2003 and is under the patronage of German Federal President Horst Köhler. The idea behind it is simple. Students can trade in their schoolbooks and notebooks for garden shears, paint brushes, or microphones in an effort to assist underprivileged youth in Africa.

The money raised is donated to the NGO Human Help Network. HHN then invests the donations in a variety of development projects in five countries in Africa: Angola, Ruanda, Burundi, South Africa and Sudan.

This year we have got two student representatives for “Aktion Tagwerk”. Julius Kühn and Alexander Klinner from Grade 11 will introduce the initiative to the other High School students at assembly on Tuesday, May 25th, present the projects, show a power point presentation to illustrate where last year’s money went to and also give more detailed information to interested students. Students will also receive blank work contracts and flyers about “Aktion Tagwerk”.

With the contracts students can go to potential employers, explaining the initiative and asking for a job on June 21st. Potential employers can be found everywhere: the shop around the corner, the local supermarket, the farmer down the street, the company where the parents are working..... The students then need to bring a copy of the signed contract to the BBIS High School Office. That way we know where they will spend the day and on the attendance register this will be marked as a school activity.

If you as parents are in the position to offer a job to one or more students on June 21st then please let me know. I can then allocate those jobs to students who, due to language problems, have not succeeded in finding a job for themselves.

Please note that taking part in Aktion Tagwerk is purely voluntary for the students. However, school encourages students to do so, as it is a chance to help others through their own effort and making new experiences along the way. Teachers will make sure that no school work is missed on the day. Those students who do not take part in Aktion Tagwerk will have to attend school.

We hope that many of our students will join in this work day for a good cause and help make this a successful event. If you have further questions, please do not hesitate to contact me or to get in touch with “Aktion Tagwerk” directly.

The basic idea: A voluntary social action of students during one school day for a good cause. The money earned on that day goes directly to projects helping children and youths in developing countries.

On that day students experience school in a completely different way and they have got a chance to get an impression of a work environment.

The initiative can be seen as a one-day work placement, e.g. in the shop around the corner, in mum's office ...

The action of our students here will directly help students in Africa.

Last year more than 200 000 students all over Germany earned a total of more than 1.3 million Euro that went to projects in Africa.

# NEWS FROM THE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

My apologies for not getting an article into the Kaleidoscope last week. The day just got away from me!

A lot of decisions have been taken in the last few weeks that I am happy to announce to you.

**The Elementary School is growing!** Next year there will be four sections of Gr. 3 and 5. There will also be an additional section of Early Childhood.

The growth in EC allows us to rethink our program a bit. We have decided to go to **straight age groupings**. There will be an EC 3 year old group, two EC 4-year old groups and two EC 5-year old groups. The current EC 3-4 teachers will move with their youngest students to EC 4 so they will have the benefit of building the two year relationship they expected to have in the EC 3-4 program.

The four Gr. 3 classrooms will **move into the newly renovated level I of House I**, next to the new library. This area will also house the two German classrooms.

The four Gr. 5 classrooms will be in the current Gr. 5 rooms and Lorraine Jacobs Hyde's current Gr.4. That Gr. 4 will relocate into the current German/Resource room.

The current Gr. 2 which is in Ms Samii's room will move into the current Gr. 3 Ms Sarkar's room.

All the EC and Gr. 1 classrooms will fit into the current Gr. 1/EC hallway as the German room will now be available as well.

The **Library planning** is moving along well. I will present some of the details at my Coffee Morning on June 9<sup>th</sup>. Please come along and hear all about it!

**I have hired some more teachers.** In Gr. 1 we will welcome Michele Corley\* who is moving here from a private school in Atlanta Georgia (US). She has been teaching there for 13 years and had recently completed a graduate degree (between a Masters and a PhD) in Reading. David Sexsmith\* (a Canadian) will join the Gr. 3 team. He has worked at Munich International School and Berlin Metropolitan teaching Gr. 3 and is very excited to be sticking with his favorite grade level. Hamish Clark will be the fourth teacher in Gr. 5. He is originally from New Zealand and is currently at BIS teaching Gr. 5. He has a passion for using information technology to meet our PYP learning goals.

### WE ARE MOVING!?!

So let's [HELP](#) build a [RAFT](#) together and take the time [NOW](#) to celebrate each other, share goodbyes and cherish our memories!

Dear Parents, Students and Colleagues,

The transition process is a complex and emotional time. This is something many of us choose to avoid and deny due to many unfinished or difficult goodbye of the past. It requires a lot of energy to move and deal with the logistics of settling life in one place and starting it new in another place. It is important to attend and support our kids and families as they are embarking on this journey and to be aware of actions you can help them take to ease the transition:

[You can help your children and yourselves foster the community's awareness of the transition process we are all involved in!](#)

[In the ES](#) we are trying in a very concrete way support our families in transition – those moving on for the next academic school year. In order to accompany our students and their families in a process of saying goodbye and finding closure for their experience with us at BBIS, we have given the ES students leaving each a FRIENDSHIP BOOK & are making "BERLIN BOXES" with them to help collect and treasure memories and their time here with us in.

Between now and the end of the year, this book will be going home nightly with a student in that child's classroom. We are asking parents and teachers to remind the children to fill in the

information on a page—it is in German this year (next year we hope to have our own BBIS version, so they can refer to what answers others have given—and also to include a photo. The sticker-photos from your picture-day order is perfect. If you don't have one of these, maybe you can easily print and cut to size one from your computer. If a book comes home to your house please do this book the evening it is sent home so that the book can continue to be passed to the next friends from the child's classroom or other classrooms.

When you send the book back, we are also trying to gather bits to add to a "Berlin Box" for each of them. These might be little pieces to remind them of their time in Berlin. Ideas may be rocks, dried leaves or flowers, postcards, pictures clay/fimo products as presents from each other, Ampelmann bits, souvenirs from BBIS—key chains, bags, pencils/pens, etc. Hopefully you have ideas as well. Any extra BBIS logo items at your house? Add a lanyard, or a water bottle (or feel free to shop the BBIS store). The idea is to have the kids leave with a bit of Berlin in their hearts and pockets. Please think of participating, as transition is difficult enough in a transient community.

In the MS/HS teachers and parents can help your students by suggesting they start up with something like a friendship or scrap book album now and/or embark on a consistent journey of building their "RAFT" (see below) now instead of waiting until the last week and having everything overflow all at once!

#### Building a RAFT

The following tips follow the RAFT format (Reconciliation, Affirmation, Farewells, and Think Destination), a concept for healthy Goodbyes discussed in *THIRD CULTURE KIDS*.

#### Reconciliation:

If there are any loose ties or relationships you feel need mending, spend the time to reach out. Once you are gone it is hard to reconcile and regrets can be a block for being able to build new relationships

#### Affirmation:

Take the time to tell friends, colleagues and neighbors what they mean to you. Write notes or cards; let the people you care about know it  
Have the children/family make a special 'Berlin Memory Scrapbook'  
Let your children use a disposable camera so they can take photos of special people and places  
Have your children pack one special box just for them with things they want to keep

#### Farewells:

Organize a 'Goodbye' Party for adults and children so you can have a formal goodbye and closure. (Movie party, Beer Garden Gathering, Picnic on the Elbe, etc.)  
Have children make 'Let's keep in Touch' cards with information to give their friends  
Make a paper clip chain with each link representing the move. Each evening remove one together  
Get emails and addresses of friends you want to keep in touch with. Be honest about the reasons for the move  
Make a family chart listing the pro's and con's to living in Berlin and the pro's and con's to living in the new location  
Think positively and talk positively about the move to help the children form a positive feeling about change  
Take a farewell tour of favorite places, restaurants, parks, etc.  
Take a cutting of a favorite plant to put in a new garden

#### Think Destination:

Phone/email the children's new school with any questions before you arrive. Let the children look at the new school's website (if available) to help them visualize where they will be going  
See if the new school can put your child in contact with a student of the same age  
Research the new location as much as possible  
Buy books or watch movies about the new location  
Look up locations where you and your family members may be able to continue hobbies (dance centers, swimming pools, sports clubs, craft stores, food stores, etc.)

In closing we want to thank you for your continued care and support for each other in the BBIS community! Also know, for next year we will have our own BBIS Parent Guide and "Friendship/Scrapbook" with a children's guide integrated available for you all!

But for now PLEASE help by starting today to actively support families in transition and help teach this very important process to each other and especially our children, since we are a global and transient community which needs to learn to work with a flowing open approach to hellos and goodbyes:

*'In order to leave, one must loosen ties, let go of roles, disengage. In order to transplant a plant, one has to pull up its roots. Just as when transplanting a plant, however, a person's roots must be carefully disengaged; they will otherwise be torn and damaged and not be able to take firm hold again in the new location'*
